Barb, barbells and boodle were the center of Tom's attention throughout his four years. With the second class year, he became aware of another phase of his cadet life – academics. Tom served on active duty in the Army (Infantry and then Military Police Corps MPC) for 4 years, resigning in 1965, with the rank of Captain. His first assignment was with with the 560th Military Police Company and then the 82nd Military Police Detachment. During this time he also served with the 5th Special Forces Group (Green Berets), 101st Airborne Division in Vietnam.

After leaving active duty in the Army, Tom had a successful career as a Special Agent with the Federal Bureau of Investigation FBI. Tom passed away on 2 December 2024, from Lewy body disease.
