Died – 21 Sept. 2018 (age 82) at Cocoa Beach. To be buried at West Point.

Ron served on active duty in the Army (Infantry) for 26 years, retiring in 1986, with the rank of Colonel. His first assignment was with the 1st Cavalry Division in Korea and Aide de Camp for the Commanding General, 1AD, Fort Rucker, AL (Flight School), Fort Benning, GA (Infantry Advanced Course), Vietnam (1st tour, Platoon Leader, 227 Assault Helicopter Battalion, 1st Cavalry Division), Germany (4th Armored Division, AD), Vietnam (2nd tour, Company Commander, Aviation Battalion, 4th Infantry Division, 4AD), Fort Knox, KY (Theater Army Replacement Command, TARC), Norfolk, VA (Armed Forces Staff College, AFSC), Durham, NC (Duke University), West Point, NY (Instructor, History Department), Fort Bragg, NC (Executive Officer, 1st Battalion, 508th Airborne Infantry Regiment, Commanding Officer, Training Battalion, XVIII Airborne Corps), Ann Arbor, MI (University of Michigan, UMI), West Point, NY (Professor, History Department).

After leaving active duty in the Army, Ron had a successful career in business working at the New York Stock Exchange with the Sarroff Sager Company (West Point classmate) and Triad Securities. Ron passed away on 21 September 2018, from cancer.

Footnote from Ron – "Our dream was shattered by the dreadful disease, Alzheimer's, which claimed Zy as a victim. However, our love deepened as we fought the losing battle and our last moment together ended with a soft, loving kiss and a smile. She was beautiful even in death. Zy and I had a wonderful life together and she now awaits me entombed in the Old Cadet Chapel at West Point."
